

ORDINANCE NO. 24

ACCEPTING HARDING STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT
CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA., AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY, ESTABLISHING THE
WIDTHS, PROVIDING FOR THE PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAID
HARDING STREET.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town
Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and
it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the
same, that Harding Street, from its intersection with Wonder
Street to its intersection with Shady Lane, within the limits
of the Boro of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., shall be accepted
and the same hereby is accepted as a public highway.

Section 2. That the width of said Harding Street shall be established and the same hereby is established at 40 feet. The width of the roadway from Wonder Street to the Hochstein Road shall be established and the same hereby is established at 24 feet, and the width from the Hochstein Road to Shady Lane shall be established and the same hereby is established at 20 feet, said widths being from face to face of curb. The width of the sidewalks from Wonder Street to the Hochstein Road shall be established and the same hereby are established at 10 feet each, said widths being from the face of the curb or edge of the roadway to the property line.

Section 3. That Harding Street from its intersection with Wonder Street to its intersection with Shady Lane shall be and the same hereby is authorized to be graded and paved with a reinforced concrete pavement, together with all necessary sewers, drains and incidental work thereto, in accordance with the plans, specifications and directions of the Borough Engineer. The Committee on Highways and Sewers shall be authorized and hereby are authorized to proceed with said work on the foot front plan and in accordance with the petition on file for the paving of said Harding Street.

Section 4. That one-third of the total cost of the grading, paving and improving of said Harding Street shall be appropriated and the same hereby is appropriated and the Borough Treasurer is hereby authorized to make payments on same from time to time on estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer, approved by the Borough Council.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and hereby are repealed.
