

ORDINANCE NO. 26

ESTABLISHING THE WIDTHS AND PROVIDING FOR THE GRADING PAVING AND IMPROVING OF A PORTION OF THE HOCHSTEIN ROAD, AND APPROPRIATING THE MONEY FOR THE GRADING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAID PORTION OF HOCHSTEIN ROAD IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that the width of the Hochstein Road shall be established and the same hereby is established at 33 feet from the intersection with the line of the City of Johnstown to its intersection with Wonder Street, all within the limits of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., The width of the roadway shall be established and the same hereby is established at 20 feet from the face of the curb to the face of the curb, and the width of the sidewalks shall be established and the same hereby are established at 6.5 feet from the face of the curb to the property line.

Section 2. That that portion of the Hochstein Road from its intersection with the line of the City of Johnstown to its intersection with Harding Street shall be and the same hereby is authorized to be graded, curbed and paved with a reinforced concrete pavement, together with all necessary sewers, drains and incidental work thereto, in accordance with the plans specifications and directions of the Borough Engineer. The Committee on Highways and Sewers shall be authorized and hereby are authorized to proceed with said work on the foot front plan and in accordance with the petition on file for the paving of said portion of Hochstein Road.

Section 3. That one-third of the total cost of the grading, draining, paving and improving of said portion of Hochstein Road shall be appropriated and the same hereby is appropriated and the Borough Treasurer is hereby authorized to make payments on same from time to time on estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer approved by the Borough Council.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
