

ACCEPTING A PORTION OF ORCHARD STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY, ESTABLISHING THE WIDTHS AND GRADES THEREOF AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAME TOGETHER WITH ALL INCIDENTAL WORK, APPROPRIATING THE MONEY AND ASSESSING THE COST THEREOF ON THE FOOT FRONT PLAN.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa.,, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of same that, that portion of Orchard Street, [from its intersection with Olive Street to its intersection with Diamond Boulevard] within the limits of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., shall be accepted and the same hereby is accepted as a public highway.

Section 2. That the width of the said portion of Orchard Street shall be established and the same hereby is established at sixty feet; that the widths of the roadway and sidewalks shall be established and the same hereby are established at twenty four (30) feet from face to face of curb for roadway and eighteen (15) feet from face of curb to property line for sidewalks; that the grades shall be established and

hereby are established as shown on the plan and profile, 3-A-12 Sheet 19, dated August 18, 1938 on file in the office of the Borough Engineer.

Section 3. That said portion of Orchard Street from its intersection with Olive Street (to its intersection with Diamond Boulevard) including the necessary highway intersections and returns shall be paved and the same hereby is authorized to be paved with a two(2) inch Amiesite (Bituminous Concrete) top together with all necessary and incidental work, in accordance with the plans, specifications and directions of the Borough Engineer, as prayed for by a petition of a majority of the property owners in interest and in number abutting on said portion of Orchard Street, dated July 22, 1941.

Section 4. That the Committee on Highways and Sewers shall be authorized and hereby is authorized to proceed with the advertisement and completion of said work on the foot front plan in accordance with the petition on file for the improvements of said portion of Orchard Street.

Section 5. That one-third of the total cost and expense of paving and improving of said portion of Orchard Street, together with all incidental work thereto, shall be appropriated and the same hereby is appropriated from the balance of the fund provided for in item 41d in the Annual Budget for 1941 and the Borough Treasurer is hereby authorized to make payment of same on estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer and approved by the Borough Council.

Section 6. That two-thirds of the total cost and expense of paving and improving of said portion of Orchard Street together with all necessary and incidental work thereto, as provided by the Borough Ordinance, shall be assessed and the same hereby is assessed on the foot front plan to the abutting property owners.

Section 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed..
