

ORDINANCE NO. 70

ACCEPTING A PORTION OF EDWARD STREET AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY AND ESTABLISHING THE WIDTHS THEREOF. ACCEPTING THE IMPROVEMENTS ON EDWARD STREET AND ORANGE STREET, INCLUDING GRADING, DRAINING AND PAVING AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE BOROUGH'S SHARE OF SAID GRADING, DRAINING AND PAVEMENT ON EDWARD STREET AND ORANGE STREET.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that, that portion of Edward Street from its intersection with Penn Street to its intersection with Myrtle Street, within the limits of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., shall be accepted and hereby is accepted as a public highway.

Section 2. That the width of Edward Street shall be established and the same hereby is established at sixty feet; that the width of the roadway and sidewalks shall be established and the same hereby are established at twenty-four feet from face to face of curb for roadway, and eighteen feet from face of curb to property line for sidewalks.

Section 3. That the improvements placed on Edward Street between Penn Street and Myrtle Street and on Orange Street between Wonder Street and Edward Street, including grading, draining and concrete pavement, under contract awarded to Charles Ressler on competitive bids, after due advertisement, by Joseph Siciliano and John Kipilo dated April 30th 1926, shall be accepted and hereby are accepted as municipal improvements and Borough property.

Section 4. That one-third of the total cost of the grading, draining and paving of the above portion of Edward Street and Orange Street shall be paid by the Borough of Southmont out of the General Fund and the Borough Treasurer is hereby authorized to pay said one-third of the total cost of the grading, draining and paving, as shown by estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer dated July 9th 1927.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby repealed.

Passed finally in Council this 12th day of September 1927.
