

ORDINANCE NO. 32

ESTABLISHING THE WIDTHS, PROVIDING FOR THE GRADING, CURBING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF A PORTION OF STATE STREET AND APPROPRIATING THE MONEY AND AUTHORIZING SAME.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that, that portion of State Street from its intersection with Leon Street to its intersection with Olive Street, within the limits of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., shall be and the same hereby is authorized to be graded, curbed and paved with a one course reinforced concrete pavement together with all necessary sanitary and storm sewers, manholes, dropinlets, and all other work incidental thereto; in accordance with the Engineer. The Committee on highways and sewers shall be authorized and hereby is authorized to proceed with said work on the foot front plan and in accordance with the petition on file for the paving of said portion of State Street.

Section 2. That the width of the roadway and sidewalks shall be established and the same hereby are established as follows: From the intersection of Olive Street to the intersection of Thoburn Street, the width of the roadway shall be 36 feet from face to face of curb and the sidewalks 12 feet from face of curb to property line, and from the intersection of Thoburn Street to the intersection of Leon Street the width of the roadway shall be 24 feet from face to face of curb and the sidewalks 18 feet from face of curb to property line.

Section 3. That one-third of the total cost of grading, paving and improving of said portion of State Street shall be appropriated and the same hereby is appropriated, and the Borough Treasurer is authorized to make payments of same from time to time on estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer and approved by the Borough Council.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
