

ORDINANCE NO. 71

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VACATION OR CHANGING THE WIDTHS OF A PORTION OF CERTAIN STREETS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA SUBJECT TO CERTAIN RESERVATIONS AND RESTRICTIONS.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, that a strip of Shady Lane $12\frac{1}{2}$ feet in width along the lower or southerly side of said Shady Lane beginning at the intersection of Harding Street at the corner of lot of Lee Upton, known as No. 31 Harding Street and extending in a northwesterly direction along Shady Lane to the intersection of Thumb Alley at the northerly corner of lot No. 1 Block 9, shall be vacated and the same hereby is vacated.

Section 2. That a strip of Cox Street $10\frac{1}{2}$ feet in width along the lower or southerly side of said Cox Street, beginning at the intersection of Shady Lane at the corner of lot No. 38 Block 10 on Shady Lane and extending in a northwesterly direction along Cox Street to the intersection of Shady Lane at the northerly corner of lot No. 64 Block 10 on Shady Lane, shall be vacated and the same hereby is vacated.

Section 3. That the portion of the aforesaid streets to be vacated shall include all of the ground between the back of the present curb and the property line as shown on the plan of Cambria Steel Company, Civil Engineering Department, of Shady Lane Developments, dated December 14, 1921.

Section 4. That a strip of ground not less than 3 feet in width adjacent to the curb of the portions of the streets hereby vacated shall be left unobstructed at all times.

Section 5. That the right of way for all necessary and convenient sewers, water lines, gas lines, power and telephone lines now installed or that may hereafter be necessary to install in the portion of said highways above vacated, with the free and unrestricted right of ingress, egress and regress at all times for constructing, maintaining and making the necessary repairs and extensions from time to time, without liabilities to the Borough or any public Service corporation shall be and the same hereby are reserved by the Borough.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
