

ORDINANCE NO. 89

ACCEPTING A PORTION OF FLOYD STREET AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that, that portion of Floyd Street in the above Borough, as shown on the Borough map, extending from the easterly side of Marion Street Extended N.  $50^{\circ} 10'$  E. 92 feet to the westerly side of Chestnut Street (formerly Clem Alley) shall be and the same is hereby accepted as a public highway.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
