

ORDINANCE NO. 7

PROVIDING FOR THE WIDENING AND ESTABLISHING THE WIDTH OF WONDER STREET FROM STATION 32+ 08.4 TO STATION 35+ 16.2 AND APPROPRIATING THE NECESSARY LAND FOR SAME AND PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF VIEWERS TO ASSESS THE DAMAGES AND BENEFITS.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of same that the width of Wonder Street, from station 32+ 08.4 to station 35+ 16.2 shall be, and hereby is established at 45 feet.

Section 2. That a portion or strip of land belonging to Henry M. Fisher be and the same hereby is appropriated from the widening of Wonder Street, same being bound and described as follows: Beginning at a point of a curve S. $74^{\circ} 52'$ E. 149.2 feet from the westerly line of land of Henry M. Fisher being Lot "N" on the Elim plan of Lots and line of land of the F.W. Otto, Estate; thence by a curve to the left having a radius of 1007.56 feet an arc distance of 195 feet to a point on line of land of F.W. Otto Estate; thence by same S. $10^{\circ} 27'$ W. 10.7 feet to a point; thence S. $50^{\circ} 34'$ W. 9.8 feet to a point on the northern line of Wonder Street as it now exists; thence by same N. $74^{\circ} 52'$ W. 189.7 feet to the place of beginning, containing 1260 square feet, more or less being a portion of Lot "M" and "N" as laid out on the Elim plan of Lots.

Section 3. A map or plan showing the lines and location of said Henry M. Fisher land herein appropriated, titled Borough of Southmont showing property of Henry M. Fisher and F.W. Otto Estate, appropriated for the widening of Wonder Street

from station 32+ 08.4 to station 35+ 16.2, further designated by index number 5-D-107, is now on file in the office of S.E. Dickey & Co., Borough Engineers and with the Borough Secretary.

Section 4. That viewers be appointed according to law to assess damages done and benefits accruing, if any, by reason of the widening, opening and appropriating said land to be used as a public highway if the same cannot be amiably agreed upon by the Borough of Southmont and the Owners of said land.

Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.
