

ORDINANCE NO. 212

ELECTION BY THE BOROUGH TO JOIN THE MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM; AGREEING TO BE BOUND BY ALL THE REQUIREMENTS AND PROVISIONS OF THE MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT LAW AS APPLICABLE TO MEMBER MUNICIPALITIES; AND STATING WHICH OF CERTAIN OPTIONS PERMITTED UNDER THE SAID LAW ARE ACCEPTED BY THE SAID BOROUGH.

The Borough of Southmont hereby ordains as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Southmont, having placed all of its employees, as far as they are eligible, under the Federal Social Security Act, hereby elects to join the Municipal Employees' Retirement System, as established by the Act of June 4, 1943, P.L. 886, as last amended by the Act of September 23, 1959, P.L. 390, and does hereby agree to be bound by all the requirements and provisions of the act, and to assume all obligations, financial and otherwise, placed upon member municipalities by the said act provided; Membership of elected officials and for employees of the Borough paid on a per diem basis shall be prohibited. Provided further credit for prior service toward the municipal annuity of each original member shall be limited to ten years, and the Borough does hereby assume the liability for payment of one hundred (100%) per cent of the municipal annuity for the prior service of each original member not in excess of ten years.

Section 2. The Borough does hereby, incorporate the said Municipal Employees' Retirement Law, as last amended by the Act of September 23, 1959, P.L. 390, as a part of this Ordinance in so far as the said act, as amended, applies to a member municipality, having accepted the options set out in the first section of this ordinance.

Section 3. All ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance and specifically ordinance No. 202 passed September 12, 1960, are hereby repealed.
