

ORDINANCE NO. 102

PROVIDING FOR THE PAVING OF A PORTION OF HANNAH ALLEY IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA ON THE FOOT FRONT PLAN WITHOUT A PETITION, APPROPRIATING THE MONEY AND ASSESSING TWO-THIRDS OF THE COST THEREOF TO THE ADJUTING PROPERTY OWNERS.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it hereby is enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that, Hannah Alley from its intersection with Orchard Street to its intersection with Chestnut Lane, shall be and the same hereby is authorized to be paved with a Bituminous Pavement on the foot front plan without a petition.

Section 2. That one-third of the total cost and expense of paving and improving of said portion of Hannah Alley, together with all incidental work thereto, shall be appropriated and the same hereby is appropriated and the Borough Treasurer authorized to make payments of same from the general fund upon estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer and approved by the Borough Council.

Section 3. That two-thirds of the total cost and expense of paving and improving of said portion of Hannah Alley, together with all incidental work thereto, shall be assessed and the same hereby is assessed on the foot front plan to the abutting property owners.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.

Passed finally in Council this 10th day of August A.D. 1931.
