

ORDINANCE NO. 15

PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF AND THE ACCEPTANCE OF WONDER STREET AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY FROM STATION 36+ 65.4 TO 14+ 73 OR ITS INTERSECTION WITH THE BOUNDARY LINE OF THE CITY OF JOHNSTOWN, PENNSYLVANIA, AND PROVIDING FOR THE GRADING AND PAVING OF SAME.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same, that Wonder Street shall be and the same hereby is accepted as a Public Highway from station 36+ 65.4 to about station 14+ 73, or its intersection with the boundary line of the City of Johnstown.

Section 2. That said Wonder Street shall be graded and paved with a concrete base and a vitrified brick pavement 24 feet wide from station 36+ 65.4 to station 14+ 73 or its intersection with the line of the City of Johnstown, Pennsylvania.

Section 3. That the grading and paving of Wonder Street from station 36+ 65.4 to station 14+ 73 or its intersection with the line of the City of Johnstown, Pennsylvania shall be done by Trevorrow-Crissey Construction Company, Incorporated as an addition to their present contract dated Oct 12, 1921 for paving and grading Wonder Street and Diamond Boulevard from station 36+ 65.4 to station 110+ 68 or its intersection with the Millcreek Road, at the same unit prices and all other terms and conditions contained therein.

Section 4. That the necessary application or procedure be taken to secure aid from the County of Cambria through the County Commissioners up to two thirds of the cost of the completion of said grading and paving of Wonder Street from station 36+ 65.4 to station 14+ 73 or its intersection with the boundary line of the City of Johnstown, Pennsylvania.

Section 5. That the line width and grades of Wonder Street shall be, and the same hereby are, established as shown on plans 5-A-4 sheet 7, and 5-A-4 sheet 8, now on file with the Borough Secretary and in the office of S.E. Dickey & Company, Borough Engineers.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
