

ORDINANCE NO. 73

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE GRADING, DRAINING, CURBING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF LILLY STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA., ESTABLISHING THE WIDTHS THEREOF, PROVIDING FOR THE APPLICATION TO COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR STATE AID AND APPORTIONING THE MONEY FOR THE SAID GRADING, DRAINING, CURBING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAID LILLY STREET.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it hereby is enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that Lilly Street from its intersection with Harshberger Street to its intersection with Miller Court at the Upper Yoder Township line, within the limits of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., shall be and the same hereby is authorized to be graded, drained, curbed, and paved with a reinforced cement concrete pavement or with a Bituminous surface pavement, together with all necessary sanitary sewer storm sewers, manholes drop inlets and all other work incidental thereto; in accordance with the plans, specifications and directions of the Borough Engineer as prayed for by petition of the property owners.

Section 2. That the width of said Lilly Street from its intersection with Harshberger Street to its intersection with Miller Court at the Upper Yoder Township line, shall be established and the same hereby is established at sixty feet; that the widths of the roadway and sidewalks shall be established and the same hereby are established at twenty-four feet from face to face of curb for roadway, and eighteen feet from face of curb to property line for sidewalks.

Section 3. That application shall be made and the proper officers are hereby authorized to make application to the County Commissioners for the construction of said section of highway under the State Aid Plan on a fifty per centum basis.

Section 4. That one-half of the total cost and expense to the Borough for grading, draining, paving and improving of said Lilly Street, together with all incidental work thereto, shall be appropriated and the same hereby is appropriated and the Borough Treasurer authorized to make payments of same from time to time on monthly estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer during the progress of the work.

Section 5. That one-half of the total cost and expense of the Borough for said grading, draining, paving and improving of said Lilly Street together with all incidental work thereto, and the total cost of all curbing and sanitary sewer, as provided by the Borough Ordinance shall be assessed and the same hereby is assessed on the foot front plan to the abutting property owners.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
