

ORDINANCE NO. 90

VACATING A PORTION OF FLOYD STREET AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA., AND RESERVING CERTAIN RIGHTS-OF-WAYS AND EASEMENTS THEREIN.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that, that portion of Floyd Street in the above Borough, as shown on the Borough map, extending from the easterly side of Marion Street Extended N. 50° 10' E. 92 feet to the westerly side of Chestnut Lane (formerly Clem Alley) shall be and the same is hereby vacated as a public highway.

Section 2. That the right of way for all necessary and convenient sewers, water lines, gas lines, power and telephone lines now installed or that may hereafter be necessary in that portion of Floyd Street above vacated with the right of ingress and egress at all times for constructing, maintaining and making the necessary repairs and extensions from time to time, shall be and the same are hereby reserved by the Borough of Southmont.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
