

ORDINANCE NO. 111

PROVIDING FOR MAXIMUM SPEED OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON THE
STREETS OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA.,
AUTHORIZING THE PLACING OF SIGNS, AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES
FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

Be it enacted and ordained by the Borough of Southmont,
and it is hereby enacted and ordained as follows:

- Section 1. No motor vehicles shall be operated upon the streets
or highways of the Borough of Southmont at a speed in excess
of twenty-five miles per hour.
- Section 2. The aforesaid speed limit shall not apply to vehicles
restricted by law to lower maximum speeds; nor to vehicles
operated under the directions of the police, nor to fire
departments or fire patrol vehicles, nor to ambulances spe-
cially exempted; nor to vehicles passing school buildings,
street cars, safety zones or where traffic is controlled by
a peace officer or traffic signal, nor in other restricted
zones where lower speed limits are fixed by the Motor Vehicles
Law of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- Section 3. Signs shall be erected on the right-hand side of the
several highways facing traffic, and on the left-hand side of
one-way streets, at intervals no greater than one-eighth of a
mile, and marked at the end of limited zone with a sign indi-
cating the end of said limited zone.
- Section 4. Prosecutions and penalties for driving vehicles in
excess of the aforesaid limits shall be instituted and enforced
as provided in the Motor Vehicles Laws of the Commonwealth.
- Section 5. All ordinances or sections of ordinances, in conflict
herewith are hereby repealed.
