

ORDINANCE NO. 33

ACCEPTING A PORTION OF OLIVE STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY, ESTABLISHING THE WIDTHS, PROVIDING FOR THE GRADING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAME AND APPROPRIATING THE MONEY FOR THE GRADING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAID PORTION OF OLIVE STREET.

- Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it is hereby enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that, that portion of Olive Street from its intersection with Diamond Boulevard to its intersection with Orchard Street, within the limits of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., shall be and the same hereby is accepted as a public highway.
- Section 2. That the width of said portion of Olive Street shall be established and the same hereby is established at 60 feet. That the width of the roadway shall be established at 30 feet from face to face of curb and the width of the sidewalks shall be established and the same hereby are established at 15 feet from face of curb to property line.
- Section 3. That that portion of Olive Street from its intersection with Diamond Boulevard to its intersection with Orchard Street shall be and the same hereby authorized to be graded, paved and curbed with a re-inforced concrete pavement together with all necessary sanitary and storm sewers, manholes, drop inlets and all other work incidental thereto, in accordance with the plans, specifications and directions of the Borough Engineer. The committee on highways and sewers shall be authorized and hereby are authorized to proceed with said work on the foot front plan and in accordance with the petition on file for the paving of said portion of Olive Street.
- Section 4. That one-third of the total cost of grading, paving and improving of said portion of Olive Street shall be appropriated and the same hereby is appropriated, and the Borough Treasurer is authorized to make payments of same from time to time on estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer and approved by the Borough Council.
- Section 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
