

ORDINANCE NO. 66

ACCEPTING A PORTION OF HELEN STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY ESTABLISHING THE WIDTHS PROVIDING FOR GRADING, DRAINING, CURBING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAME AND APPROPRIATING THE MONEY FOR THE SAID GRADING, DRAINING, CURBING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAID PORTION OF HELEN STREET.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., and it hereby is enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that that portion of Helen Street from its intersection with State Street to its intersection with Leila Street within the limits of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., shall be accepted and the same hereby is accepted as a public highway.

Section 2. That the width of said Helen Street shall be established and the same hereby is established at sixty feet; that the width of the roadway and sidewalks shall be established and the same hereby are established at twenty four feet from face to face of curb for roadway, and eighteen feet from face of curb to property line for sidewalks.

Section 3. That Helen Street from its intersection with State St. to its intersection with Leila Street including the necessary highway intersections and returns, shall be and the same hereby is authorized to be graded, drained, curbed and paved with a reinforced cement concrete pavement or a concrete base with a bituminous surface, together with all necessary sanitary sewers, storm sewers, manholed, drop inlets and all other work incidental thereto, in accordance with the plans, specifications and directions of the Boro Engineer as prayed for by the petition of the property owners, acknowledged on the 14th day of March A.D. 1927.

Section 4. That the committee on highway and sewers shall be authorized to proceed with the advertisements and completion of said work on the foot front plan in accordance with the petition on file for the improvement of said portion of Helen Street.

Section 5. That one-third of the total cost and expense of grading, draining, paving and improving of said portion of Helen St. together with all incidental work thereto, shall be and hereby is appropriated and the Borough Treasurer authorized to make payments of same from time to time on estimates prepared by the Boro Engineer and approved by the Borough Council.

Section 6. That two-thirds of the total cost and expense of grading, draining, paving and improving of said portion of Helen Street, together with all incidental work thereto, and the total cost of all curbing and sanitary sewes, as provided by the Borough Ordinance shall be assessed and the same hereby is assessed on the foot front plan to the abutting property owners.

Section 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same hereby are repealed.
