

ORDINANCE NO. 63

ACCEPTING A PORTION OF OLIVE STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTHMONT, CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA AS A PUBLIC HIGHWAY ESTABLISHING THE WIDTHS, PROVIDING FOR THE GRADING, DRAINING CURBING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAME AND APPROPRIATING THE MONEY FOR THE SAID GRADING, DRAINING, CURBING, PAVING AND IMPROVING OF SAID PORTION OF OLIVE STREET.

Section 1. Be it enacted and ordained by the Burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Southmont and it hereby is enacted and ordained by the authority of the same that, that portion of Olive Street from its intersection with State Street to its intersection with Diamond Boulevard within the limits of the Borough of Southmont, Cambria County, Pa., shall be accepted and the same hereby is accepted as a public highway.

Section 2. That the width of said portion of Olive Street shall be established and the same hereby is established at sixty feet; that the width of the roadway and sidewalks shall be established and the same hereby are established at thrity feet from face to face of curb for roadway, and fifteen feet from face of curb to property line for sidewalks.

Section 3. That said portion of Olive Street from its intersection with State Street to its intersection with Diamond Boulevard including the necessary highway intersection and return, shall be and the same hereby is authorized to be graded, drained, curbed and paved with a reinforced cement concrete pavement or a concrete base with a Bituminous surface pavement together with all necessaty sanitary sewers, storm sewers, manholes, drop inlets and all other work incidental thereto, in accordance with the plans, specifications and directions of the Borough Engineer, acknowledged on the 14th day of February A.D. 1927.

Section 4. That the committee on highways and sewers shall be authorized and hereby are authorized to rpoceed with the advertisements and completion of said work on the foot front plan in accordance with the petition on file for the improvements of said portion of Olive Street.

Section 5. That one-third of the total cost and expense of grading, draining, paving and improving of said portion of Olive Street together with all incidental work thereto, shall be appropriated and the same hereby is appropriated and the Borough Treasurer suthorized and hereby is authorized to make payments on same from time to time on estimates prepared by the Borough Engineer and approved by the Borough Council.

Section 6. That two-thirds of the total cost and expense of grading, draining, paving and improving of said portion of Olive Street, together with all incidental work thereto and the total cost of all curbing and sanitary sewer as provided by the Borough Ordinance shall be assessed and the same hereby is assessed on the foot front plan to the abutting property owners.

Section 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be and the same herby are repealed.
